Italy has world-class souvenir shopping – and we don't mean plastic trinkets. Think world famous markets, delicatessens packed full of local specialty foods, and the flagship stores of world-famous Italian designers. Each year on Aug 17, the northern Italian fishing village of Porto Venere is illuminated with more than 2,000 torches for the festival of the White Madonna, a tribute to the town's patron saint. The lights extend onto this rocky spur, which juts into the Gulf of La Spezia, also known as the Gulf of Poets. With views like this, we can easily see how it inspired poets and artists throughout history-including Lord Byron, who is said to have swum across this body of water to visit fellow poet Percy Bysshe Shelley.

Did you know?

The first **ITALIAN NEWSPAPER** in the U.S. was New York's L'Eco D'Italia in 1849.

Italian sailor **GIOVANNI DA VERRAZZANO**, from Florence, was the first European explorer to pass New York Harbor.

The first Italian to live in the United States was **PIETRO CESARE ALBERTI**, a Venetian sailor who settled in New York on June 2, 1635.

FILIPPO MAZZEI, an important physician and a good friend of Thomas Jefferson, acted as an agent to purchase arms for Virginia during the American Revolution.

THE TALIAFERRO FAMILY, originally from Venice, came to America in the 17th Century from England, and was one of the first families to settle in Virginia.

Thomas Jefferson and Ben Franklin were familiar with the Italian language and culture and with Roman history.

Though Italian presence was sparse before 1850, LORENZO DA PONTE, who wrote librettos for Mozart, taught the Italian language and literature at Columbia University. In 1825, he produced his Don Giovanni in New York.

VATICAN CITY is the only nation that can lock its own gates at night. It has its own phone company, radio and TV stations, money and stamps. It even has its own Army – the historic Swiss Guard.

No other country in Europe has as many **VOLCANOES** as Italy. This is because the Italian peninsula stands on a fault line.

Soon after the **TOWER OF PISA** was built in 1173, it began to lean. They believe it was caused by a poorly laid foundation. After reconstruction efforts in 2008, engineers declared the Tower should be stable for another 200 years.
