Buon Festa del Ringraziamento! (Happy Feast of Thanksgiving)

Does Italy Celebrate Thanksgiving? Not exactly. Italy does not have a national holiday that celebrates Thanksgiving. However, you will find plenty of Italians toasting the holiday with their expat friends and family at a home or restaurant. Although Italians do love a celebration, you won't be watching the Macy's Day Parade or football games all afternoon Italians who do celebrate our Thanksgiving may not celebrate it on a Thursday. If they do, it would have to be in the evening. Why? Not being an official holiday for them, Italians have to go to work and the children go to school on our traditional Thanksgiving. Generally, they would celebrate on a Friday or Saturday so that family and friends are able to join them and it tends to be a more relaxing occasion.

Are there Italian Thanksgiving Traditions? Most American Thanksgiving traditions are not celebrated in Italy, for cultural and logistical reasons. Italian Thanksgiving traditions tend to revolve more around food and special Italian recipes to accompany the roast turkey. The menu for Thanksgiving in Italy isn't identical to the American menu, but it is similar. Before the turkey arrives and side dishes even land on the table, an entire Italian feast is served (family style) – pasta (mostly lasagna), pumpkin risotto, antipasto platter or pumpkin soup, just to name a few. Apple or pumpkin pie would be served for dessert along with many other delights.

An aside: Whole turkeys are not found at the butcher shop in Italy, so if they want a whole turkey for Thanksgiving, it will need to ordered 2 to 4 weeks in advance. Invited guest may be told not to bring anything, but if you don't want to show up empty-handed, you might consider arriving with: wine, flowers, chocolates/candy, a tea towel or candle. And, while Black Friday in Italy is becoming a big sales day for brick and mortar and online stores, it's nothing like the crazy shopping day in the U.S. Discounts are much less compared to the U.S. so that no fights break out over TV's or toys!



November to me is not only the month for celebrating Thanksgiving, but I think it's also the month to honor ALL our Veterans all month long (November 11 Veterans Day) who served, gave their lives and limbs so that we can enjoy the freedom we celebrate every day. God Bless ALL of them!

After receiving a calendar in the mail (one of about 50 I received) I especially took note of the one titled "Women Airiforce Service Pilots." Of course, I had heard of the WASP before, but never really gave much thought to it. So, after looking the calendar over, I then thought it would be nice to focus on the women who served about whom we don't hear too much.

I'm sure there are some reading this that either served in some way during the war effort OR knows of someone who did – the "Rosie the Riveters" with bandanas to boot! To all of those women --- THANK YOU!

The National WASP WWII Museum is dedicated to honoring the life and legacy of the Women Airforce Service Pilots (waspmuseum.org).

In 1942, as the country reeled from the attack on Pearl Harbor, trained male pilots were in short supply. Qualified pilots were needed to fight the war. The Army was desperate for pilots to deliver newly built trainer aircraft to flight schools in the South. Twenty-eight civilian women pilots volunteered to ferry those airplanes. They formed the Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS) in late summer of 1942 as the country's first female squadron.

Between November 1942 and December 1944, 1,074 more women were trained to fly military aircraft – first in Houston, Texas and then moving to Avenger Field in Sweetwater, Texas. The WAFS, founded by Nancy Love, were combined with Jacqueline Cochran's Women's Flying Training Detachment (WFTD) to become the Women's Airforce Service Pilots (WASP)!

The WASP flew every aircraft in the Army's arsenal. In addition to ferrying, they towed gunnery targets, transported equipment and non-flying personnel, and flight-tested recently repaired aircraft before they were put back into service. For over two years, the WASP performed a wide variety of aviation-related jobs while serving at more than 120 bases around the United States.

General "Hap" Arnold, commanding general of the Army Air Forces, championed the WASP. Despite being revered by Congress, Arnold's request to designate the WASP as members of the U.S. military was denied in June 1944. The WASP were granted military status in 1977, thanks to a law signed by President Carter. The 1,102 Women Airforce Service Pilots flew wingtip to wingtip with their male counterparts and were just as vital to the war effort.

And, on a Personal Note ...

"I love trying the recipes in Il Giornale. Often they are for things I remember my grandmother making for us as kids. This time it was my daughter, Francesca in charge. I've had the ricotta cookie recipe on the bridge for a while and when she heard about our lodge bake sale she knew what we would make. She made the recipe her own and proudly brought her cookies to our bake sale complete with stories of where we found the recipe. Needless to say she sold out of our artigianale cookies. These things are exactly the kind of tradition the lodge helps pass along. We had a great time baking together and maybe starting a tradition of our own."

THE MARYLAND WINE WITH AN ITALIAN ACCENT

FATHER VINCENT R. CAPODANNO, M.M., SERVANT OF GOD

Vincent Capodanno (1929-1967), a Staten Island, New York native, was the youngest child of a large - 10 siblings - Italian American family. His Italian father immigrated from Gaeta (Lazio Region), and his mother was Italian American. In 1949, after attending Fordham University and working in the insurance field, Vincent Capodanno entered the Maryknoll Seminary in Ossining, New York. He was ordained a Maryknoll priest by Cardinal Francis Spellman of New York in 1958. After missionary work in Taiwan and Hong Kong, Father Capodanno decided to join the Navy Chaplain Corps in 1965, and after he was commissioned a Lieutenant in 1966, he volunteered to serve with the Fleet Marine Service in Vietnam. A year later, after a month of leave, he returned to Vietnam for a voluntary 6-month extension, and was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. During his Marine Corps service, Father Capodanno earned the nickname the «Grunt Padre» from his Marine Corps companions.


On September 4, 1967 (the Labor Day holiday), with Company D of that Marine Corps unit, Father Capodanno took part in «Operation Swift,» in the Thang Binh district of the Que Son Valley. It was then, while his unit was pinned down by heavy enemy fire from the North Vietnamese Army, and while administering first aid, last rites, and comfort to wounded and dying Marines, that Father Capodanno died in a hail of bullets. For his ... «gallantry and intrepidity»... «above and beyond the call of duty,» on January 7, 1969, Lieutenant Vincent R. Capodanno was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor posthumously by President Lydon Johnson.

A few years after his untimely death, on November 17, 1973, the US Navy commissioned the USS Capodanno (FF-1093, a Knox-class frigate), the first Navy ship to be blessed by a Pope, Saint John Paul II. It was not until 2002 that the Catholic Church opened Father Capodanno's «Cause for Canonization,» and in 2006 he was declared «Servant of God,» the first in the four-step process towards ultimate recognition as a saint. Key to this process is the recognition and certification by the Catholic Church that miracles can be attributed to saintly persons such as Father Capodanno. In his case, it was recognized that in 2019, following prayers to Father Capodanno, a Florida woman was healed of multiple sclerosis (MS). But additional, similar proof will still be needed to further the cause.

Discussing Father Capodanno's life and the process of his canonization will be Vice Admiral Stephen P. Stanley, USN (Ret.), who was appointed Board Chairman of the Father Vincent Capodanno Guild by the Archbishop of US Military Services, Timothy P. Broglio, in 2019. The Guild is a not-forprofit organization established in 2013 to promote the Cause for Canonization of Father Capodanno.

Part of Admiral Stanley's talk will likely include a power point presentation and discussion of the 2017 film produced by the Catholic TV network, EWTN, «Called and Chosen.»

Canonization is never a certainty. So, will Fr. Capodanno join the pantheon of American Saints, now numbering 15, including such familiar names as St. Mother Cabrini, St. Elizabeth Seton, Native American St. Kateri Tekakwitha, and most recently, Fr. Junipero Serra? Questions such as this were explored on the evening of the November 14th as we listened to and interacted with Admiral Stanley at the Little Italy Lodge concluded with the distribution of special prayer cards for the intention of Father Capodanno's canonization.
