I'm sure you know and are proud of the many Italians who have played a huge role in the way of "influence" on the world...

This information came from a booklet complied by Brothers Dan Longo and Judge Ed Angeletti many years ago called "Our Italian Heritage." It was compiled mostly because we, as Italian Americans, have heard very little about our history and what these "heroes" did and accomplished for the world.

Marcus Tullius Cicero (Cicero) of Apirnum, Italy (106-43 B.C.), known as "the Supreme Index to His Age," in the first century B.C. was the father of the idea of "Natural Law." This idea marked the beginning of what was to be Rome's greatest gift to civilization, its legal system! Cicero defined the idea as follows:

"There is in fact a true law; namely, right reason, which is in accordance with nature, applies to all men and is unchangeable and eternal. But its commands, this law summons men to the performance of their duties; by its prohibitions, it restrains them from doing wrong. This law arises from the very nature of mankind itself, meaning respect for life and property, good faith and fair dealing."

In 550 A.C. under **EMPEROR JUSTINIAN**, a commission arranged in scientific form the "body of Civil Law" known as the "Justinian Code" that became the foundation of the legal system of most European countries? These principles also influenced the formation of the Common Law of England, which America adopted in 1776. It is now embedded in the fabric of our modern society.

The Justinian Code recognized the equality of all citizens before the law. A married woman in Rome enjoyed freedom and liberality under Roman Law. She could mingle freely in society and was a friend and confidente of her husband, as well as the housekeeper. She could own property in her own name and buy and sell objects of value.

Those rights came gradually to women of the western world and it was not until the late nineteenth and early twentieth century that recognition of those rights became generally accepted. The Romans recognized them more than 2,000 years ago! **

**As an aside: Many years ago, Italian lawyers here in Maryland formed a lodge called the "Justinian Lodge" for Italian attorneys only. Some of you reading this may remember the lodge and unfortunately no longer exists.

NICCOLO MACHIAVELLI (1496-1527) became known as the "Father of Modern Politics," the first political analyst. He is credited with originating a "new science" called Political Science. Popular theories on politics in the world today are very often patterned after his philosophies on the subject.

In the latter part of the 18th century, **Luigi Galvani** (1737-98) of Genoa and **Alessandro Volta** (1745-1814) of Rome discovered the "first means of producing a steady current of electricity," which became known as Volts, thus fulfilling the words in Genesis, "Let there be light," and then there was light!"

On December 2, 1967, at the 25th Anniversary celebration of the first nuclear reactor, President Lyndon Johnson said, "More than any other person, this anniversary observance honors the great Italian physicist, Enrico Fermi, for it was the scientists under his direction who accomplished the event we are celebrating today, the first controlled release of energy from the nucleus of the atom. Enrico Fermi's experiment opened up a new world of matter and energy...and placed in our hands the power of the universe itself."


Let's celebrate this as a key part of our Italian heritage. And let's thank our parents, grandparents and great grandparents, the ones who made all this possible. Remember.

This is an excellent spicy, rich soup. It's simple to make, yet a delicious winter soup idea. Add extra vegetables such as carrots and celery!

INGREDIENTS:

2 tablespoons olive oil
3 cloves garlic, minced
2 tablespoons chopped onion
4 (3.5 ounce) links
Italian sausage, sliced
8 cups chicken stock
1 teaspoon dried oregano
1 tablespoon dried basil
¼ cup chopped fresh parsley
2 cups uncooked white rice

½ cup heavy cream

DIRECTIONS:

Heat oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add garlic and onion and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes, or until tender. Add sausage, browning well on all sides, about 5 minutes.

Add chicken stock, oregano, basil, and parsley. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to low and simmer for one hour.

Add the rice and simmer 30 minutes. Add cream, stirring well. Remove from heat. Let soup rest briefly before serving.
